MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JODY

But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."

— Isaiah 40:31, NIV)

HAPPY NEW YEAR!!!

I like words, and I like to know where those words come from. I find that a little study of the history of a word can add a new depth of understanding to it. As we stand at the beginning of another new year, there are three words on my mind right now, and I'd like us all to get to know them a little better: Resolution, Resiliency and Renewal.

You might immediately notice that all three of these words begin with the prefix "re." Defining this little add-on is probably the best place to start. "Re," as many of us were taught in elementary school, means "back" or "again". It describes a sort of return to a previous state. This is an important first step in understanding these three words.

Resolution: Have you made any New Year's Resolutions? These are the commitments or promises we make to do something differently. But do we know what we're actually saying? Here's the history lesson: In the 14th century this word, from the Latin *resolutionem*, was used to describe the process of returning or reducing something into its simpler parts. Think, re- solving a math problem by breaking it down into easier bits. By the 16th century it was used to describe a firmness of characters and steadfastness of purpose. I wonder how those two meanings inform your choice of resolutions for the New Year. Are there any ways that you need to simplify or return to the basics in order to find certainty of purpose?

Resiliency: This is one of my favorite words of all time. This word has been used since the early 1600's and comes from the Latin word, *Salire*, to "leap" or "jump". Knowing what we know about "re," resiliency literally means to "jump back", or perhaps more familiarly, to "bounce back". Around the 1800's it started to be used in the world of science to describe a substance's ability to return to it's original shape after having pressure inflicted upon it. In time we have come to apply this phrase to the human spirit, a measure of our own ability to return to our original "shape" after enduring external pressure. Any ideas on how you might nurture your resiliency in 2023?

Renewal: This final word probably doesn't need as much of an explanation, and is certainly one that is used often in the culture and context of the Christian Church. It is a return to "newness". Since the late 1600's this word has been describing a regenerative process whereby that which is depleted is given new life.

Resolution, Resiliency and Renewal. These are my hopes for each of you in the New Year. Whatever changes or challenges may come, may you be resolved in facing them. Try breaking them down into simpler parts, recognizing that you don't need to solve every piece in one moment, but step by step can handle what you are facing. Lean into your *God* given resiliency, knowing that what *God* called good can be so once again. *God* shaped you in *God's* own image. However life pressures you to change shape, know you can return to that God- shape in which you were first formed. Finally, through resolve and resilience, may you know renewal. May you experience a freshness of life, able to more fully recognize the ways *God* continues to make, "all things new."

STEWARDSHIP RECHARGE REPORT PART I

As of November 28th, **pledged** giving for 2022 totaled \$259,968 or about 97.9% of the total pledged amount (\$265,616). Non-pledge donations totaled to \$48,521 for the first eleven months. Our Pledged giving battery is almost fully energized and we have surpassed our budget goal for non-pledge donations (\$45,000)! — thank you!

STEWARDSHIP RECHARGE REPORT PART II

As of December 7^{th} , 63 families had pledged \$207,076 for the 2023 budget year. This will go a long way toward supporting the proposed 2023 budget. Thank you to those who have already pledged! Thank you to those who are still prayerfully considering how to support the church in 2023.

Over the past four years, there have been months when the cash flow of Poughkeepsie United Methodist Church would have made paying the expenses in support of our church & it's missions, a challenge. Yes, the CARES ACT Payroll Protection Program plus the loan forgiveness by Trustee's were both very helpful. But, there was not one month where cash inflows were not sufficient to cover cash out-flows. That is a testament to you, the congregation of Poughkeepsie United Methodist Church. And we thank you.

With your generosity, plus the Payroll Protection Program, plus Trustee's loan forgiveness, Poughkeepsie United Methodist Church will end fiscal year 2022 with a positive fund balance (non-restricted checking + savings) greater than \$100,000. (see 2023 budget planning, below)

It is your generous spirit that will continue to drive Poughkeepsie United Methodist Church forward as we strive to fulfill our missions in service to *God*. Please be in prayer for our church, the members of the Finance Committee, and how you may serve in 2023.

In November, the Finance Committee moved \$11,750 from the non-restricted checking into SOS to bring the account back to its original fund balance. This funding was made possible, in part, by the Paycheck Protection Program of the CARES Act in 2020 and 2021. This funding was also made possible by you, the congregation.

A little history, in response to the financial crisis of 2007 to 2009, this Seeds of Strength account was created in Summer 2009 to provide a cash reserve "buffer" for PUMC. The original funding was \$23,914 in 2009. In 2010, an additional \$9,000 was raised, for total funding of \$32,914.

BUDGET ACTUAL VS PLANNED

Revenues \$ 320,538.28 Expenses 307,445.76 Net Ordinary Income \$ 13,092.52

As of **November 28, 2022, 11 months** into the 12 month **fiscal year** (i.e.,91.67%), the **Total Revenue** = 77.4%, and **Total Expenses** = 74.3%.

For your information, apportionment payments are paid monthly and are current as of November 28, 2020.

SOME OF WHAT YOUR FINANCE COMMITTEE HAS ACCOMPLISHED IN 2022 INCLUDES:

- **Finalizing 2022 Budget** cash flows that included anticipated revenues and expenses of \$413,835. To balance the budget, anticipated revenues included allocating \$49,079.00 of prior year retained revenues. As of November 28th the revenues have exceeded expenses (see Net Ordinary Income, above).
- 2023 Budget Planning is in process. The last piece will be the final amount of pledged giving for 2023. TBD? The 2023 budget proposal of anticipated revenues will include allocating a portion of prior year retained revenues, to balance the budget. The specific amount will be in the final budget proposal.
- Audit of 2022 Church Finances to commence in February 2023.
- **Shred Event** is tentatively planned for Wednesday, April 26, 2023, to reduce the volume of unneeded paper records. This event will be open to the congregation to bring your unneeded paper records to shred, for a small fee.
- Employee Retention Credit (ERC) is part of the Paycheck Protection Program of the CARES Act. This is a reimbursement credit against part of our employee salaries in both 2020 and 2021. The church bookkeeper, *Matt Regan*, CPA, is looking into our eligibility for this program.

HYMN BACKGROUNDS

A few months ago, I took a course online called Congregational Song: Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow. Throughout the course we looked at music as a whole used in worship services, from the traditional hymns to more contemporary music, to anthems, to instruments used and everything in between. For our final project we had to choose any 5 hymns, do some research on them, and present the information in any way we chose to the class. I found the overall experience really interesting and thought I'd share some hymn details and fun facts as a regular newsletter submission.

Of course, many people now know my favorite hymn is "All Hail the Power of *Jesus* Name" — which, depending on what tune you want to use, you can find in our hymnal on pages 154 (Coronation tune) and 155 (Diadem tune, my favorite). So, I had to start with that one.



This hymn was written by *Edward Perronet*, a minister in the Church of England, in 1780. He actually worked with the Wesleys until there was a split over the question of administering the Sacraments. The original text of the hymn was posted in Gospel Magazine with the title "On the Resurrection"

There are three tunes associated with this hymn. The first was a tune called Miles Lane (*Shrubsole*), which was composed specifically for the hymn. The other two tunes I mentioned already, Coronation written by *Oliver Holden* and Diadem written by *James Ellor*. A fun fact about the tune Coronation – *Holden* wrote the tune originally to celebrate his daughter's birth, but after discovering *Perronet's* lyrics the tune was linked to the hymn's words. "All Hail the Power of *Jesus* Name" can currently be found in 3,243 different hymnals with a mix of those three hymn tunes and can be used during Advent, Christmas, Easter, and ordinary times in the Christian year.

The words of the hymn declare the majesty of *Christ* and encourage us to make that known to all. "We'll join the everlasting song" is a way to say that we, too, are part of the song.

Cheese-topped Beef Bake

- 1 package (16 oz) medium pasta shells
- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 jar (26 oz) spaghetti sauce
- 1 envelope taco seasoning
- 1 carton (8oz) spreadable chive and onion cream cheese.
- 1 cup (8 oz) sour cream
- 1 cup (4 oz) shredded cheddar cheese

Cook pasta according to package directions.

Meanwhile in a large skillet, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink; drain.

Stir in the spaghetti sauce and taco seasoning. In a small bowl, combine cream cheese and sour cream; set aside.

Drain the pasta; stir into beef mixture.

Transfer to a greased 13in x 9 in. baking dish.

Spread with cream cheese.

Bake, uncovered, at 350 degrees for 25 - 30 minutes or until the cheese is melted.






