MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JODY

"*Jesus* said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?" — John 11:25-26

Greetings Family and Friends of PUMC! Well, do you? Do you believe Jesus' statement that he is "the resurrection and the life"? Do you even understand what that means? Resurrection is the theological foundation on which the entire Christian belief system is built, and yet too many people in our churches aren't sure what to make of it. To be fair, it's probably natural to have questions and curiosities about something that seems to run so contrary to our daily experience. As a friend of mine used to say, "last time I checked, death rates in this county are still 100%."

In preparation for Easter this year, I want to write a little about the theological import of Easter. To have this conversation we need to define a few important terms (I'm using the book Crazy Talk, a Not So Stuffy Dictionary of Theological Terms, Edited by one of my former professors, <u>Rolf A</u> <u>Jacobson</u>):

Resurrection: "The act of *God* by which new life is given to the dead." **Eschatology**: "The Study of the way things get worse before they get better..." **Happy Exchange** (*frohliche Wechsel*): "God says, 'everything that is mine is yours, and everything that is yours is mine."

Atonement: "the act of *God* by which *God* takes us, who are out of sync with both God and neighbor, and sets us right."

The resurrection of *Jesus* (and us) falls in the general theological field of eschatology, the study of things having to do with "the end" which isn't really an end at all. It's confusing, but stay with me. Inseparable from resurrection is God's work of atonement, specifically, substitutionary atonement which is the belief that *Christ's* death, in place of our own, has set us right with *God* and one another. <u>Martin Luther</u> called this the frohliche wechsel, or the "happy exchange". In place of sin, punishment and death we receive forgiveness, atonement and new life, which brings us to resurrection.

Resurrection does not make people undead (don't worry, you're not going to be a zombie), it makes people fully alive. There's a big difference. Resurrection is not simply the undoing of death, but the instilling of newness and abundance of life. I'm not just talking quantity and a lot of it (eternity sounds long), but quality! Resurrection is not about possibility or promises, it is about reality. This is our life in *Jesus Christ*, because the best part is we experience resurrection every day. Resurrection, in my humble opinion, is not a single miraculous act that is one and done. Resurrection is the daily renewal and recreation of my soul, leading me ever more fully into the fullness of life *God* has made available to me.

It is true that every Sunday in the Christian Church is a resurrection Sunday, but Easter is the day we give this important element of our faith a special stage. So, may you not only celebrate this good news, may you live it, daily, as *God* leads you into the truth of life. Many blessings on that journey.

SPOTLIGHT ON STEWARDSHIP: PIECE # 3 - TERRITORY

The first thing I think of when I hear the word "Territory" is an old Western movie untamed land that is claimed by some individual or group, and then defended toothand-nail from other groups who want to take it. But our territory is also just the place we live. For my dog, my yard is her territory and she will defend it from strangers with her incessant barking. For me, my territory is the Hudson Valley where I have lived for many years and raised a family. On a national level, the United States is our collective territory, which we all try to protect from the evils of the world. On a global level, all the lands and seas are territories we need to protect from harm.

The big question is: how can we be good stewards of whatever definition of territory we prefer? PUMC has a Green Team that cleans up litter on our stretch of New Hackensack Road each quarter. We also have a garden group that plants beautiful and pollinator-friendly gardens. Individually, there are people who care for the birds (and other wildlife) who visit their yards. There are still others who do their best to conserve water and not pollute waterways. Then there are folks who try to reduce air pollution with cleaner cars and cleaner energy systems. There are all kinds of ways to care for our territory, which is not really ours at all, but is *God's* creation "on loan" to us. In Genesis, *God* specifies that we are entrusted with its care.

This month I am asking myself, "How can I better care for my territory?" How about you?

"*God* blessed them and said to them, 'Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground.' "- Genesis 1:28 (NIV)

A meeting of the Church Council was held on Wednesday, March 1st. Highlights included:

- A new website is being developed will be more up-to-date, have needed information and contacts, and be easier to navigate.
- Since many scholarships are available through the United Methodist Church, a PUMC scholarship is on hold. Research will continue so information can be provided to our students to apply for appropriate ones.

PUMC'S CHILDREN'S HANDBELL CHOIR

Great things keep happening at PUMC! On March 5th, after church service, we began rehearsals of the Children's Handbell Choir! They had fun, learned new stuff, and are looking forward to the next Sunday's rehearsal. I thank the **Ringers' parents for supporting this new experience for their kids.** When ready, they will have the honor of enhancing the worship service with their music!

HYMN BACKGROUND 1

Sometimes I gain a love for hymns when I experience them in a different way. When I was in choir at Wappingers, we did cantatas from time to time during Advent and on Palm Sunday. The Palm Sunday cantata most times was a journey through narration and song of key moments in the life of *Christ* as one approached Palm Sunday and Holy Week, culminating in a joyous song celebrating the resurrection of *Jesus*.

But before we got to that celebratory song, there was always one or two that covered those more somber events of the Last Supper and the Crucifixion of *Jesus*. One cantata the hymn written by <u>Isaac Watts</u>, "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" which I then gained a new love for.

<u>Isaac Watts</u>, was an Assistant Minister of the Independent Church in 1698 and by 1702 became a pastor, but before that was writing what Hymnary.com called "respectable verses" by the age of seven. He wrote this hymn in 1707, originally intended as a communion hymn.

The tune for "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" that we are familiar with is Hamburg, written by <u>Lowell Mason</u> in 1825. Additional tunes that you may find the same lyrics for include Rockingham written by <u>Edward Miller</u> in 1780, and three tunes by <u>Scott Werdebaugh</u> written in more recent times, Love So Amazing/<u>Werdebaugh</u> (1978 and updated in 2018), Old Palatine (1995), and Rockingham/<u>Werdebaugh</u> (2008). It is found in 1,900 hymnals with a mix of those tunes and used during Year A in the lectionary on the 5th Sunday of Epiphany, Palm Sunday, and on Good Friday.

"When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" was <u>Isaac Watts</u>' crowning achievement. It originally had five stanzas, but one was removed in order to focus the singer's attention on their own response to *Christ's* crucifixion as opposed to the crucifixion itself. This hymn starts with a contemplation of the cross and how worldly achievements and possessions pale in comparison, followed by a representation that *Christ* went to the cross out of love for us, and finally in the last verse we see the response we should have to this amazing love is complete devotion.

Now for some Fun Fact . . .

- 1. It is said that <u>Charles Wesley</u> stated he would give up all he had written to have been the author of this powerful hymn.
- 2. Our United Methodist Hymnal has great information about the hymns we sing each week. They list the writer of the words of the hymn, the tune of the hymn, and who wrote the harmonies to the hymns. When you get to the back of the hymnal, you can find hymns listed if they have particular scriptural references, sorted by those tune names (so you can learn which hymns share the same tunes!), and also by topics and categories. Take some time to look at our hymnal for your favorite hymn or a hymn you aren't familiar with and learn more about it!




