

CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

The Church Council met on Wednesday, June 7 th for a program meeting. A brief summary includes:

The only order of business was the approval of the Clergy Housing Allowance Exclusion for Pastor *Kregg Gabor's* **2023** appointment.

The focus of the session was on decreasing the use of plastic and increasing recycling opportunities within the church. *Pam Terwilliger* led the session which included small group discussions. Short term goals were developed and prioritized. Future sessions will be scheduled and members of the congregation will again be invited to participate.



WHAT DO I DO WITH NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTIC? (AND HOW DO I IDENTIFY IT?)

Toxic plastics put aside, how do you know which kinds of plastic can be recycled? Numbers 3, 6, and 7 generally cannot be recycled, though some recycling centers have the technological capability. In the event that your recycling center has the capability to recycle these generally non-recyclable plastics, they can be transformed into useful items like egg cartons, vents, speed bumps, cables, paneling, and more. Check with your local recycling center to see if they accept #3, #6, and #7.

Not sure if the plastic you're trying to recycle is on the no-no list? As a general rule, you should be able to check the bottom of the bottle or container where the number will be. If it's a #3, #6, or #7, it's likely non-recyclable, but like we mentioned, check with your center. Number 3s are generally single-use plastic wraps, window cleaner and detergent bottles, shower curtains, vinyl piping, flooring, and home siding — anything known as PVC or vinyl. Since #6 is Styrofoam, anything that is a Styrofoam cup, plate, carry-out container, egg carton made of foam, disposable cutlery, or a CD case generally cannot be recycled. For #7, look out for plastic baby bottles and sippy cups, water jugs, sunglasses, Nylon, signs, medical storage containers, plastic cutlery, and toys and electronics that are part plastic.

That being said, there is some hope for those "unrecyclable" plastics. Sometimes #4 and #5 can be recycled, so again, it's important to consult your local recycling center to see what they accept.

Items like soft drink bottles and water bottles, peanut butter jars, cleaning products, cooking oil containers, milk and juice containers, laundry detergent bottles, shampoo and conditioner containers, cereal box liners, and yogurt and butter tubs are usually #1 or #2. This means, in many cases, these items can be easily recycled.

As far as #4 and #5, items made from these kinds of plastic (polyethylene low-density and polypropylene), which can sometimes be recycled depending on technology, are generally take-out containers, microwavable trays, grocery store bags, plastic wraps, frozen food containers, bread bags, squeezable bottles, ketchup bottles, some baby bottles, fast-food syrup containers, yogurt containers, straws, and more.

SPOTLIGHT ON STEWARDSHIP: PIECE # 6 - TESTIMONY

In the musical "Hamilton" there is a song entitled "Who lives? Who dies? Who tells your story?" I reflect on this more and more these days. Here is a story from my family. My grandfather was the son of poor immigrants. His mother died when he was seven, and her replacement was the proverbial wicked stepmother. His parents made him quit school when he was fourteen, so he could help support his family. Life was hard for much of his early adulthood. Thankfully, someone in his early life introduced him to *Jesus*, and he became active in a church community. In spite of all the obstacles he faced, he did his best to follow *Jesus*' example and treat others with kindness and compassion. He grew into a man of strong faith. At age 53, he was diagnosed with inoperable cancer and given 6 months to live. His entire community prayed fervently for his healing. Six months later, the cancer was gone. My family considers that one of *God's* miracles. My grandfather died before I was born, but my grandmother told his story ... over and over. I feel like I knew him personally. And now I tell his story. I continue to give testimony to *God's* work in him and through him.

Jesus' disciples knew there was something special, something miraculous, something Holy about *Jesus*. They knew he was the son of *God*. They knew his story – and they shared it with everyone. They told the story verbally - they even wrote the story down, so that <u>everyone</u> who heard it or read it would feel like they knew *Jesus* personally. And everyone would continue to tell this miraculous story . . . over and over.

Now, I will be the first to admit, I am not good at sharing testimony about the difference *Jesus* has made in my life. I am so thankful for the people at PUMC who have had the courage to share their testimony with me. It strengthens my faith and gives me hope. In April, Friendship Circle sponsored a speaker who talked about developing your "Elevator Pitch" – a thirty second statement that reveals who you are – and opens the door to richer conversations, which can include a faith witness. It reminded me that it really is important to tell your story, and how *Jesus* fits into it.

So, this month I am asking myself, "What is my Elevator Pitch" - my testimony? How about you?

"I love to tell the story of unseen things above, of *Jesus* and *His* Glory, of *Jesus* and *His* love. I love to tell the story, because I know 'tis true; it satisfies my longings as nothing else can do. I love to tell the story, 'twill be my theme in glory, to tell the old, old story of *Jesus* and *His* love."


