MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KREGG

The rolling of your thunder was heard, your lightning-flashes lit up the world, the earth shuddered and shook. Your way led over the sea, your path over the countless waters, and none could trace your footsteps. You guided your people like a flock by the hand of <u>Moses</u> and <u>Aaron</u>.

- Psalm 77:18-20

Author *Scott Walker* begins his latest book, <u>Glimpses of God</u>; <u>Stories that Point the Way</u>, with a gripping narrative of a group of young men lost in the woods on a dark stormy winter's night. The young men had spent the day hunting. They were to meet back at a certain field by a certain time, but one, *Walker* himself, fell asleep in a tree and ended up getting back as a fierce storm moved into the valley. Another young man got lost in the woods as the darkness gathered. The three men who waited for him on the edge of the field heard first one shot, and they let off a round in reply – following the shots, they found each other in the dark, which was complete in the icy falling winter rain.

Each young man's heart sank as they thought of the stormy night ahead, lost in the woods. Just when they resigned themselves to their fate, a blaze of lightning lit up the woods, and they could see through the trees into a field.

They made their way in its direction, navigating from thunderous flash to flash. They soon could see the car's outline on the roadside at the edge of the field. Getting in the car was a moment of relief and satisfaction. Now warm and dry, the flashes, glimpses of the way to go in the darkness led them to comfort and safety.

Walker concludes the following about this adventure:

"Perhaps, above all, the graphic imagery of the lightning has seared across my memory.
... The lightning was a pure gift; nothing we had earned or could make happen. With all of our frantic willpower we could not generate nor coerce its bursts of illumination. Rather, the lightning came to us. It was something that graced our path and gave us a sense of direction in the midst of our wandering and perplexity."

"Many times since that night I have again experienced life as one who is lost and in need of insight and guidance. Even in the brilliance of a noonday, my internal world has sometimes been shrouded and obscure, and I have found myself fighting panic and confusion.

... In all of these moments of lostness, blindness, and insecurity, I have found that *God* has been faithful to send the lightning again — a flash of something that gave me a momentary glimpse into my future or the meaning of my life." (pp. 11-12)

Sometimes in our lives, a darkness of the soul seems to cover us. We search for direction concerning careers, personal relationships, or just answers amid our affliction. How often do we grope in the dark, thinking that movement is always the best thing, as we console ourselves that at least we are doing something?

At these times, we must look for, wait for, the lightning to strike in the night, for a few more steps to become plain, and then take them in patience. Too often, we either fear the power of the flash — thinking it will change us or light up areas we don't want to pursue — or close our eyes until the light is gone and sound subsides — thinking that we can move better on our own by simply feeling the way out.


God has worked through my life in flashes. Some I have let pass by. I have closed my eyes to some flashes in the dark, fearing to look at where I was going: the precipice one sees, tends to be much more daunting than one that only might hypothetically exist. But God has allowed the grace of multiple strikes in my life, multiple opportunities to get it right in the flashes. Such providential and duplicitous Divine inspiration is the case for all of us. If you are in the middle of a storm, are you praying and waiting for God's spark to guide you? If all is well, are you just meandering down the path, or are you looking to God to still blaze in life and lead you to new vitality and joy? How are you using the Spirit's flash of direction to guide and guard your footsteps, and how are you discerning, not seizing, God's revelation for your life today?

- Employee Retention Credit (ERC) is part of the Paycheck Protection Program of the CARES Act. This is a reimbursement credit against part of our employee salaries for CNS, HTASC and PUMC in both 2020 and 2021. Any ERC funds received will be distributed pro-rata to CNS, HTASC & PUMC.
- 2024 Budget In September, the Finance Committee will begin developing the 2024 Budget.

FITTING TOGETHER OUR FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP PUZZLE FOR 2023

Pledged giving through June 30, 2023 was \$128,416 or 54.6% of our budget goal (\$235,000). Non-Pledged giving through June 30, 2023 was \$19,677 or 26.2% of our budget goal (\$75,000). Our combined giving was almost 48% of our budget goal — a little shy of our goal going into the summer months. KIDS' CORNER






Godly, biblical wisdom is more valuable than gold or silver. Make this do-it-yourself toy to practice your searching skills.
