MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

²¹ Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you."
²² And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

- John 20:21-23

"I look back upon my youth and realize how so many people gave me help, understanding, courage — very important things to me — and they never knew it. They entered into my life and became powers within me. All of us live spiritually by what others have given us, often unwittingly, in the significant hours of our life. At the time these significant hours may not even be perceived. We may not recognize them until years later when we look back, as one remembers some long-ago music or a boyhood landscape. We all owe to others much of gentleness and wisdom that we have made our own; and we may well ask ourselves what will others owe to us." (by <u>Albert Schweitzer</u>, Bit & Pieces, September 14, 1995)

Throughout his life, *Jesus* supplied those around him with spiritual gifts. Often, the disciples could not understand what he said or did. At the time, most of his actions, in their immediate context, made little sense to them. To the disciples, before the resurrection, he was a friendly mystical rabbi who, while talking with authority, mainly spoke in riddles.

Jesus knew what He was saying and knew that their collective memory would be able to account for the truth of his testimony. The above scripture takes place after the resurrection. The gathered disciples are now given, through a formal act, the authority of the Holy Spirit and are sent out even as Jesus himself went out. The Spirit torch was passed as the church's life and has been ever since: "All of us live spiritually by what others have given us...."

All of us inherit from those who have come before us a sense of the holy and a predisposition toward life. Sometimes, we have to overcome some of this acculturation, for it is occasionally not positive, but it often acts as a springboard to our development. We are taught about *God*. We learn the spirituality of others. We develop labels to attach to our experience as our reality grows.

In my years of ministry, I have encountered parents who proudly say that they did not bring their children to church because they wanted to let their children have a free choice to make a religious decision on their own, but if they do not know what it means to be a spiritual being, how can they choose? It's like opting to eat something you have never learned to be edible. Often, we decide not to risk a taste.

Spiritually, others, not only in the church, rely on us for their future, a future of joy and meaning: "All of us live spiritually by what others have given us... in the significant hours of our life." What are you giving to others? Are you providing the Spiritual nurture of life and food for the journey? Are you giving yourself? *Jesus* examples the path for us: "Peace be with you! As the *Father* has sent me, I am sending you." It is on our shoulders that the next generation seeks to stand, having in our example tasted and seen that the *Lord* is good.


"Let them praise *His* name in the dance: let them sing praises unto *Him* with the timbrel and harp."

I am writing this article on Tuesday, September 5, 2023, as *Cheryl* and I will be on vacation, the next 11 day's. The August financial reports will not be available until after I have departed.

So, this month I thought I would write about one of my favorite topics Leadership.

Who am I?

What have I accomplished?

What will I accomplish?

What will be My legacy?

How will the World be a better place for My having Lived?

Back in February, during a Service, I said that *God* had placed a call on my heart to go meet and connect with people who attend church, and those who are unchurched. It began with a realization, I was to step outside the confines of my church and my church family. To go to places I have never been and would otherwise never go. To meet people I would never meet. To learn their stories and to share those stories with other people.

Why? I did not know. Just that I was to go . . . and I have. As far as East Jewett UMC in the Catskills. As close as Living Water in LaGrange. I have been welcomed warmly and, well, ignored.

The conversation has been interesting listening to people and hearing their stories. **But why?**

Then, one day the last week of August, I was looking at my bookshelf and my eyes stopped on a book I had started many years ago and had stopped after only a few pages "**Leadership** and the Power of Ideas" by *Martin Tarcher* (I've had this book since 1993). I picked it off the shelf and started to read it, again. After reading a few pages I was reminded of a leadership podcast I had started in 2016 and stopped after only two episodes the *Craig Groeschel Leadership Podcast*.

Hmmm, leadership. Could the call *God* has placed on my heart have to do with leadership? The answer in my heart said **YES.** OK *Lord*, you have called me, I will go. How do I do this? I am studying leadership and hopefully learning leadership. But, dear *Lord*, how am I to do this? How am I to connect these people in disparate churches, and disparate faiths, far apart?

In listening to the third episode of the *Craig Groeschel* Leadership Podcast, *Pastor Craig* talked about when he started his church, they focused on only five things: Weekend worship, small groups, kids ministry, student ministry and missions. And, I had my answer to the question of How do I lead? I am to lead a **small group.**

I said to myself, I have never organized, lead or managed a small group. Immediately I realized acolytes, ushers and finance committee are all small groups. Am I leading them as a small group leader? I think not. It is time for me to learn to be a small group leader and lead.

I began this article with the **five questions** I write to begin every page in my Personal Journal. I have heard *God's* call. I do not know when, where or how this goes. Just that I am called to go...

I would ask you to ponder a **sixth question**: Where is *God* calling you, to go and lead?

God, our provider, in *Christ* you give us a spring of pure water that overflows to eternal life. Your love and hope fill our hearts, so we want to worship you in *Spirit* and truth. Open our eyes to see the places in this community where our church's ministries could reach new people. Direct our energies for your purposes and the fulfillment of your mission, so that our community will become like a field ripe for harvest. We ask this through *Christ*, our risen *Lord*. Amen

To him who by means of his power working in us is able to do so much more than we can ever ask for, or even think of: to *God* be the glory in the church and in *Christ Jesus* for all time, forever and ever! Amen.

SPOTLIGHT ON STEWARDSHIP: PIECE # TREASURE

Our church celebrates Consecration Sunday in October. It is a time when we prayerfully make a promise to financially support the church in the coming year. It is a time to take stock of our Treasures. Many years ago, before Dale and I moved to Poughkeepsie, we belonged to a church that had a sudden extraordinary expense one year. The church bell fell one Sunday morning and crashed into the Narthex. In response, the church trained a large "committee" to visit church members and solicit donations to repair the damage and fortify the bell tower. Dale and I were in a financially stable position at the time: two incomes, no kids, no mortgage, and minimal student loan debt. An additional pledge was not hard for us. As we visited church members from all walks of life, I was humbled by their willingness to do what they could. One woman, who was in a more tenuous financial situation, prayed with us and then made an additional pledge. It was not much monetarily, but it was certainly a sacrificial gift. I thought about the story of the poor widow giving her two coins to the temple – *Jesus* recognized that she had given more than all the wealthy donors. I realized this woman had pledged more than we had.

Fast forward to today, and I see that same generous spirit at PUMC. Members from all walks of life giving what they can financially, to keep the ministries of our church vibrant. It warms my heart; and it can still be humbling.

This month I am asking myself, what does *God* want me to do with my treasure? How about you?

"But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents. Calling his disciples to him, *Jesus* said, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others." — Mark 12: 42-43 (NIV)

FITTING TOGETHER OUR FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP PUZZLE FOR 2023

Pledged giving through August 31, 2023 was \$161,463 or 68.7% of our budget goal (\$235,000). Non-Pledged giving through August 25, 2023 was \$26,609 or 35.5% of our budget goal (\$75,000). Our combined giving was almost 61% of our budget goal. Pledged giving continues to stay on track. Non-pledge giving has been consistent all year, but it is lagging behind 2022 giving, and thus is below our non-pledge budget estimate. Praise *God* for all of our faithful givers! Please do keep our church finances in your prayers.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD) TO PUMC

Who?	Anyone, charitably inclined, who would like to reduce their income tax "bill" & owns appreciated stock.	
What?	A donation of stock is a transfer of shares of stock without having to sell the shares and being taxed on any increase in value (the capital gains). The shares may be in a brokerage account or, paper certificate(s) in your possession.	
When?	To help ensure your donation will be credited in the year of your choosing, it is best to begin the stock transfer process on, or before, October 15 th . The date the church receives your donated shares is the date assigned to your donation.	
How?	How? Contact the church office (845) 452-2933 to get started, in October.	
Where?	Sources that may be of assistance includes your income tax advisor and/or www.irs.gov	

STOCK DONATION TO POUGHKEEPSIE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

Who?	Anyone who has to take R equired M inimum D istributions from their retirement account in 2023.	
	A Qualified Charitable Distribution , or QCD ? A QCD is a distribution taken out of your IRA, or other qualified (pre-tax) plan and sent directly from the Plan Custodian to PUMC .	
What?	The distribution cannot be sent to you, your spouse or anyone else. By sending the distribution directly to the charity of your choice, you may be able to reduce the amount of taxable income you report in the year of the gift. By reducing the amount of your taxable income, you may also reduce the taxation of your Social Security.	
When?	It is best to give your 401(k), IRA, or other qualified plan, custodian at least 2 months to complete your distribution.	
and/or, your spouse.	Talk with your income tax advisor to determine if a QCD is appropriate for you, and/or, your spouse.	
How?	If a QCD is appropriate, contact your IRA (or other qualified plan) Custodian for their instructions to begin the QCD process.







