MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

⁸ But *God* demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, *Christ* died for us.

⁹ Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from *God's* wrath through him! ¹⁰ For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his *Son*, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life! ¹¹ Not only is this so, but we also boast in *God* through our *Lord Jesus Christ*, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

— Romans 5:8-11

"In our relationship with *God*, reason is always only a helper to passionate love; it is never on the throne. We experience *Him* by totally abandoning ourselves to whatever *He*, through *His Spirit*, wants to do in us and through us. *He* refuses to be an object that we can observe and comprehend in detached, logical thought. *God* wants a passionate love for *Himself*, not a philosophical logical theology." (*Carpe Diem*, Tony Campolo, pp. 24-25)

For so many in *Jesus*' day, Judaism had become a religion without passion. Judaism had become a religion of mechanics and debate on logic and theology, far removed from the personal needs of ordinary people living under Roman occupation. Judaism had died in many ways; it had lost its passion for *God* and life as *God's* people apart from Rome.

Not so the gospel story. Right from the beginning, we have a passionate, if not even radical, *God* who dares to move the world in a different way, not by a law codified in books and debated by scholars but by a law of passionate love written on the heart.

Jesus Christ exemplifies this law written on the human heart in many ways. From birth to death, he was utterly human. Yet in Jesus, we have a perfect human to reach for and ascribe to, but we also have in Christ the nature and being of God: God radically having come to God's people so that they might know just how deep and passionate God's love is.

It is not before *Christ's* ministry that we have an attempt to answer the question of why the "God-man," no, that is a debate of the later church, a continuing discussion. No matter how hard we try to understand the theology behind *God's* action, our understanding always returns to *God's* passion for fallen humanity. Whatever else *Christ* is to us, he is *God's* unfathomable, passionate, and mysterious love.

The church needs to be passionate. We, too, risk losing the passion of our belief, of no longer feeling that which we seek only to understand and so errantly control. Were *God* a molecule of water or the cell of an onion, understanding would be much easier. Not only because of the tools we can use but because these things are objects. *God* is a person. To understand *God*, we must relate to *God*; that is the tool of our understanding. It is out of this relation that rationalization springs into action through an incarnated faith in the world.

The church has been accused of losing this passion for the plight of humanity, being too concerned with learning about *God* and not experiencing, let alone enfleshing *God*. Christmas celebrates the creational birth of *God's* passion in *Christ*. It is a time of miracle and wonder, but Christmas also invites the church to join in on *God's* work. We sit back in awe as *God* works in our world in a new and mysterious way by taking on flesh. Only after the whirlwind of *God's* activity are we allowed time to rationalize what has happened (thank you, apostle Paul), what *God* has given us, and how we might love even as we have been loved.

Let this Christmas be a time of newness and renewal. Newness in sitting back and hearing the account of *God's* activity in the world. Newness in the promise that *God* continues *God's* work through *God's Spirit* in the world, newness in the life of *God's* people, the church, and renewal in the commitment of our spirit in co-creative harmony with God's. Renewal that reaches out to *God*, to touch *God's Spirit* as it reaches out to us with the offer of life abundant.

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK (CONTINUED)

As is true of so much of the gospel promise, Christmas springs everlasting in newness. The gift given once for all time holds out new hope as we annually approach it. Let this Christmas be a passionate one for you and yours. Open your hearts to a *God* who seeks more than just your mind but challenges us to be wholistically *God's* people in *Christ*.




SPOTLIGHT ON STEWARDSHIP: BONUS T - THANK YOU!

FITTING TOGETHER OUR FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP PUZZLE FOR 2023

Pledged giving through October 31, 2023 was \$206,068 or 87.7% of our budget goal (\$235,000). Non-Pledged giving through October 31, 2023 was \$32,782 or almost 44% of our budget goal (\$75,000). Our combined giving was 77% of our budget goal. Pledged giving continues to stay on track. Non-pledge giving is still very consistent, but it continues to lag behind 2022 giving. We always praise *God* for **all** of our faithful givers! And we praise *God* for His provision for this congregation. Please continue to keep our church finances in your prayers.

Statements were available in church on November 19th and November 26th. All remaining statements will be mailed on December 1, 2023. CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

The Church Council held a hybrid (i.e., Zoom and in person) meeting on Wednesday, November 1st. Highlights included:

- The Worship Committee has made plans for several special events, including All Saints Day, Laity Sunday, the Advent potluck dinner, and the Longest Day service on December 22.
- Consecration Sunday and the Stewardship potluck lunch were very successful, and pledges are still being received for the 2024 budget year.
- The Hospitality Committee will either sponsor a monthly dinner or support another group having an event.
- Discussions are being held to find ways to finance current programs and missions. The Finance Committee will continue to meet to seek creative solutions.
- A multi-generational program on "The Heart that Grew Three Sizes" is planned for December. Study guides for all ages are available and, if possible, the original Grinch movie will be shown.
- The Prison Ministry had a very successful weekend and there were 29 graduates.
- A Leadership bulletin insert is being developed so that members will be able to contact leaders or seek leadership roles.

- The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, January 3rd unless a meeting is needed in December. If so, it will be held via Zoom.

HYMN BACKGROUNDS 1

In choir we started practicing music to be sung during Advent and on Christmas Eve. One of the songs had the word "Nowell" in the title, and the song had parts of the familiar carol, "The First Noel" in it. Now, if you have ever sat in a rehearsal with choir with Polly, or have sung this carol with her, you will remember her saying something like, "The word is No El not No Well." This got us into a bit of a discussion about Noel versus Nowell and how it came to be that way, to which I replied, "Well, I haven't written my Journey entry yet. And it will be for December, so, I'll look up some information on the carol." And so, here I am writing about "The First Noel" or "The First Nowell."

The author of the hymn and hymn tune (The First Nowell) are both anonymous, according to Hymnary.org. So, there isn't a lot of background information on the author or the tune's composer.

However, I did find out that this carol loosely is based on the Gospel accounts in Luke 2 and Matthew 2 of the events surrounding *Jesus*' birth, the shepherds, star, and wise men. The carol was probably from the seventeenth century and the text was first printed with nine stanzas in "Some Ancient Christmas Carols" by <u>Davies Gilbert</u> in 1823.

Hymnary.org noted the carol is used at Christmas, but that the narrative is suited more to Epiphany, due to the mention of the Wise Men. "The First Noel" is published in 390 hymnals. But let's get back to Noel and Nowell. Turns out, it just is a form of the same word. The word is derived from the Latin, "natalis" which means "birth." It is about a 50/50 split in the number of hymnals that use the word "Noel" and those that use "Nowell." So, what is the difference? Noel is the French form of the word while Nowell is the English form. And, if you are at all curious, I checked with Merriam-Webster's online resource, and you do indeed say the word, whichever spelling, as "No El."

IT'S TIME FOR FRIENDSHIP CIRCLE!





