MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Therefore *Jesus* said again, "I tell you the truth, I am the gate for the sheep. All who ever came before me were thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. He will come in and go out, and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full."

FINANCE COMMITTEE COMMUNIQUÉ

Greetings from the Finance Committee! Unless there was a rebellion at Charge Conference, you all elected me as the Committee's new chair! Thank you for your support, and I look forward to your encouragement in the coming year. Likewise, we should all thank *Will Cass* for his fine work over the last 3 years steering this group, good people charged with ensuring that the finances of our church are in good order. I look forward to building upon the foundation that Will and his predecessors have left for us.

Since the books for 2023 won't be closed until mid-January, we will have to wait until the February Journey to report on how well we did and where our footing lies for the coming year.

I can report that the Finance Committee expects revenues of around \$320,000 for 2024, with around \$79,000 available in our checking account at the start of the year, which is sufficient to fund the Church Council's expected \$390,493 budget for 2024. While this plan will fully fund us for the coming year, it will also nearly deplete our cash on hand, and leave us with a significant budget challenge for 2025.

Our team will be in dialogue with our church family during the coming year to understand how we may increase our revenue or alter our expenses for 2025.

Please pray for our committee and our church as we work together to spread the Good News of *Jesus Christ.*

HYMN BACKGROUNDS 1

(Jennifer Harmer)

My first Epiphany at PUMC I started to learn the live streaming technology, back when it was two laptops up front, one for the camera and one for the PowerPoint. We had gone back to having a minimal amount of people handling the service due to another rise in COVID numbers. And *Polly James* was slated to play the prelude, a version of "We Three Kings," which she played like the sanctuary was full of people — very full and loud. You could feel the power of the organ in that space. And it was awesome.

So, as we are now in January and you will probably be reading this right around Epiphany, I thought I'd take a look at "We Three Kings."

Both the lyrics and the tune for this hymn were written by *John Henry Hopkins* (1820-1891) in 1857. He had an Episcopal background and in addition to hymn writing *John Hopkins* became an ordained deacon and later a priest in 1872. He also designed stained-glass windows, episcopal seals and various other church ornaments. An interesting fact is that he delivered the eulogy at *President Ulysses S. Grant's* funeral in 1885.

The hymn itself is used only at Epiphany in all three years of the 3-year lectionary cycle. There are five stanzas and a refrain in the hymn. The first stanza describes the journey of the magi or three kings as we commonly refer to them. The next three stanzas elaborate on the significance of each gift, and the final stanza summarizes the song.
