TODAY IS UMCOR SUNDAY



UMCOR, provides hope for communities and individuals whose lives have been upset by war, storms or other crises. This ministry is achieved exclusively through your generosity. Last year, your generosity delivered \$1.7 million towards these ministries:

- ▶ International Disaster Response efforts provide assistance following natural or human-caused disasters outside of the United States. Typical emergency response efforts include the distribution of food, hygiene supplies and facilities, nonfood items, psychosocial support and shelter.
- ▶U.S. Disaster Response works with annual conferences in the United States to alleviate suffering caused by disasters that strike within the United States and its territories. In partnership with conference level disaster response coordinators, UMCOR journeys with affected communities throughout a disaster's cycle.
- ▶ Global Migration provides relief and recovery in the form of food aid, basic necessities, and legal and transportation services for vulnerable migrants and refugees.

HOLY WEEK WORSHIP SCHEDULE

Holy Week Services - 2024

These services arose out of a heartfelt need to deepen the experience of Holy Week by connecting with and relating to the human side of Christ's struggle as he journeyed to the cross. Too often, the average worshiper

leaves Palm Sunday to return on Resurrection Sunday with only the barest of hints of the drama of the week before. Essentially, we go from celebration to celebration, not connecting and dwelling on the total emotional and painful price God paid us during Holy Week.

These services are more guided meditation encounters. The music is calm and reflective. The tone of the service is subdued. The leader is not the focus. We center on the Christ candle as it makes its way through the week to finally find its resting place on the altar on Good Friday. At the end of Good Friday's service, it is extinguished as the flame of life leaves our Savior dead in a tomb. I have found that I can only celebrate Easter by trying to feel Holy Week through the scriptures.

Every service will start at 7:00 PM. Monday through Wednesday, services will last about a half hour. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday will be a bit longer. There are very few elements of the traditional worship services of Sunday morning: we gather to sing, pray, read scripture, hear some context for the day, and walk with our Lord during His most painful days. It is that simple.
